

SEBRING, FL, March 14-16, 2014 - The proverbial third Saturday in March meant our annual pilgrimage to the Twelve Hours of Sebring right in our own back yard in central Florida. 





Next stop: The **Catfish Country** restaurant and the country fruit stand next door, where we were able to purchase some produce to enjoy at a later time.

Stop four: The **Polk County History Center** in the old Courthouse in Bartow. This was a true "hidden gem" as this was a very well done local history museum with numerous artifacts. The perfect place for our last stop was **Cherry Pockets Fish Camp**. According to folklore Cherry Pocket was founded in the late forties by a Mr. Cherry and another man. Because the land falls away where it interacts with the lake it looked like a pocket, therefore - Cherry Pocket. In the past, it was a place for hardy fishermen and very few women. Rumor has it there were cock-fights, gambling, and gator wrestling in addition to many "Big Fish Stories." Now it is totally family-friendly.

I will readily admit that I never would have found, much less stopped at the place if it were not part of the Tour. It is located out in the Florida back country on the edge of Lake Pierce. The restaurant looks like a run-down wooden shack, not a locally-famous food hot-spot. Inside, the décor is unique to say the least. Large windows look out on Lake Pierce and the deck, and the walls are covered with license plates from all over and placards with risqué quotes. However, the food was absolutely fantastic and the beer was ice cold, making the back road drive well worth it. Our Jags looked a little out of place in the parking lot, but Cherry Pockets was a perfect place to end to the great "Gone Fishin' Tour."

March 6-9, 2014 - The **2014 Amelia Island Concours d'Elegance** continued the tradition of presenting a world class (and now award wining) motoring event. The setting is the golf course at the Amelia Island Ritz-Carlton which offers the expected amenities on impeccable ocean front property. The presentation is always well organized with a spectacular collection of motorcars.

Each year features several grouped, themed collections. This year's featured collections included: Historic show cars from both Packard and Chrysler, Offenhauser powered race cars, American Underslung, Zagato coach built cars, beach cars such as the famous Meyers Manx dune buggy, and the BMW Batmobile series of race cars including the art car which was presented in a glass case. The 2014 Honoree was Jochen Mass. There are always a nice collection of Jaguars present as well as an impressive display by the Jaguar corporation. This year the new F-Type Coupe was displayed ahead of dealer introduction.

New last year was a semi-open Cars & Coffee showing on Saturday. The popularity prompted the event to be repeated this year. This is a low-key social event that encourages conversation and discovering car clubs that serve other brands. Showing a vehicle at the Sunday Concours is by application, or invitation only.

Wandering the halls of the Ritz-Carlton, I found a few members of the Automotive Fine Art Society gathered for a wonderful display of two- and three-dimensional creations. I attended both of the entertaining seminars offered on the Concours website. RM Auctions returned once again with a spectacular offering of significant automobiles. The RM preview was Friday with auction held on Saturday. Gooding & Company was also back with their preview on Thursday and sale on Friday. Gooding & Company sets up a few miles south at the Omni Resort.



You can sometimes get a room at the Ritz-Carlton. The cost is notably over \$600/night with a four night minimum. There are a few other choices in the immediate area such as the Amelia Island Omni, and just one town to the north, Hampton Inn of Fernandina Beach. But you can expect to pay more than you would otherwise expect to pay for a Hampton Inn as every bed in the area will be at rack rate. Skip the hotel habit and you will find that there are several Bed & Breakfast choices, too.

To avoid event inflated prices, you can choose from several hotels near the Jacksonville airport, or for a more scenic drive, there is a Holiday Inn Express on Blount Island. There are also a lot of hotels south of that Holiday Inn, but the drive time starts to add up if you venture too far south of Blount Island. Several JCNA members selected the Blount Island Holiday Inn which lands you 30 to 35 minutes from the Ritz-Carlton. Being the social group that we are, we gathered for a rousing dinner both Friday night and Saturday after the Cars & Coffee event.





Fernandina Beach is also an excellent destination for a meal and an after diner stroll. Although there is a shorter inland route, A1A will follow the coast from the Ritz-Carlton north to Fernandina Beach.

Eventually A1A makes a 90 degree left turn onto Atlantic Avenue which becomes Center street.

Center street runs right through the heart of Fernandina's quaint district. Tested, best choice restaurants include Kelly's Courtyard Cafe at 19, South 3rd Street. Kelly's has surprisingly good food and service for such a simple and affordable spot. A top choice from the expensive but worth it list is David's Restaurant and Lounge at 802 Ash Street.

Also on that particular list for those who reserve far enough in advance is the 5 Diamond restaurant, Salt,

at the Ritz-Carlton. On Saturday and Sunday there are assorted food tents and buffets set up special for the event on the Ritz-Carlton property which are mostly notable for meritocracy of both food and service. One is better served by reserving a table or staying a step ahead of the crowd and dining earlier at one of the permanent locations at the Ritz.

You may count me among the Amelia Island faithful as I discovered it in 1997 and have only missed one year since then. Next year will be the 20th showing of the Amelia Island Concours d'Elegance, and my only questions will be where to stay, and where to dine. If my fellow club members plan another organized attack there will be even fewer decisions to make. I will just go along for the ride and enjoy.

News - March, 2014 Report

New Museum Collection Centre: We are pleased to announce plans for a new building on the Gaydon site in Warwickshire which will provide space to store and display more than 200 historic British cars from the reserve collections of both the Jaguar Daimler Heritage Trust and the British Motor Industry Heritage Trust.

The £4 million project has been under development for two years and has just been awarded a Round Two grant of £1.45 million from the Heritage Lottery Fund (HLF). The HLF grant, together with match funding from Jaguar Land Rover, The Garfield Weston Foundation and both Trusts, will enable work on this exciting new project to begin in the very near future.

The new Museum Collection Centre will enable visitors to view many cars from the reserve collections of both Trusts for the first time in a purpose-built facility. The building will also include a vehicle restoration and conservation workshop, space for enhanced education and lifelong learning programmes and office accommodation for all Jaguar Heritage staff – bringing the whole team back together again on the Gaydon site.

This exciting new facility will be immediately adjacent to the Heritage Motor Centre museum and it is hoped that it will be fully operational during the first half of 2015.

There will be sufficient space to display all the reserve cars from Jaguar Heritage's collection which will complement the existing Jaguar galleries in the Coventry Transport Museum and the Heritage Motor Centre museum, both of which will continue as they are today.

In addition to the large range of Jaguar models in the reserve collection, the building will also allow visitors to see Jaguar Heritage's extensive collection of over 30 Daimler and Artist's impression of the new Museum Collection Centre at Gaydon 2 Lanchester models, dating from 1897 to 2002 – many of which have not been on public display before. •

Museum Displays: Visitors to the former Jaguar Heritage museum at Browns Lane, Coventry, may recall a fine display of **large posters** relating to Jaguar's motorsport activities and successes in the 1940s and 1950s.



We are pleased to report that these posters have now been put back on permanent display in the Jaguar Heritage gallery at the Heritage Motor Centre Museum at Gaydon.

The posters provide a fitting backdrop to the vehicles on display which are a

selection of some of the key models from Jaguar's illustrious motorsport history. A change has also been made to the vehicle line-up in the gallery as a consequence of the 1988 Le Mans winning XJR-9 being required as part of the heritage vehicle display at the Techno Classica show in Essen.



Taking the place of the XJR-9 is now the 1983 Group 44 liveried XJR-5. This car made its public debut at CarFest North last August (see July/August 2013 Newsletter) following a lengthy rebuild programme; this is the first time it has been put on display in a museum setting.

Later in the year, as part of the celebration of the D-type 60th anniversary, it is planned to mount a special display of appropriate artefacts, information boards and pictures in the Jaguar gallery at Gaydon. This will be timed to coincide with the Heritage Motor Centre's 21st birthday celebrations at the beginning of May. In addition to items from Jaguar Heritage's own archive, the display will also feature a number of artefacts and models kindly being loaned by the **Malcolm Sayer Foundation** and also some items from **Nigel Webb's** extensive collection.

As Jaguar historians know well, **Malcolm Sayer** is credited with the design of some of the most well-known Jaguars from the 50s and 60s including the C-type, D-type, E-type and the legendary XJ13. Malcolm had worked in the aircraft industry before joining Jaguar and introduced many innovative aeronautical techniques to the designs that he worked on– Including the first real application of aerodynamic modelling.

His grandson, **Sam Sayer**, works as a graphic designer and, appropriately, was invited to design the wall panels that will feature as part of the special display. These will detail 60 interesting facts relating to the D-type which it is hoped visitors will find educational and entertaining! Here is an example of one of the panels. •


