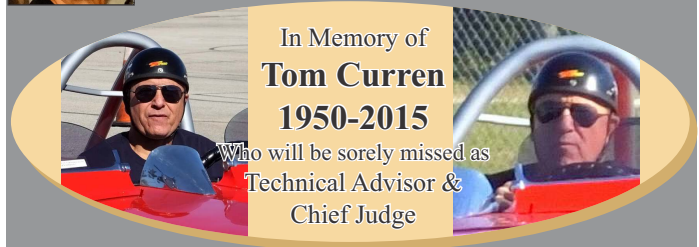

The JCCNF/JCOF Winter Slalom turned out to be a Blast. The weather was perfect, cool yet sunny, the organization was perfect and we had a good turnout of participants and spectators. More important, no vehicles were damaged! Even the laser timers behaved themselves. Hat's off to Jeff Wheeler and Tom Wright for organizing this exciting event.



This was an "Open" Slalom, meaning that in addition to participants driving Jaguars, we had an eclectic mix of vehicles including: Eddie Obi's Ferrari California, Ian Crawford's Porsche GT3 and Ian Massey's 1955 MGTF 1500, to name just a few.



Though the words 'chaos' and 'confusion' might not be adequate in describing this or any sports car slalom, you probably get the idea. "FUN" would be more completely





descriptive, especially for competing drivers. Ian Massey's JCNA North American championship winning E-type "Green Rocket" Jaguar failed to start the morning of this event, so he loaded his Porsche GT3 in the trailer and, again, won quickest overall time with just 41.714 seconds. At the opposite end of the scoreboard was JCCNF's newest member and first time Slalom competitor, Jill Casiple. Her first attempt scored a whopping 96.736 seconds BUT she quickly brought that down to a respectable 59.901 in her recently acquired 2003 XK8 DHC Jaguar. Jill also received the "Most Entertaining" award – probably because of her smiles and good natured responses to all the jeers, then cheers, from enthusiastic spectators. Slalom Master, Jeff Wheeler, started removing pylons early but also scored a respectable 45.010 seconds in his BMW 3.

No one seemed to count the times taken by Dyaarl Anderson and Mike Collins to manipulate the complex slalom course. Dyaarl's 1971 E-Type Series II and Mike's XJ-S "Double-Six" were too breathtakingly beautiful for anyone to care, as were most of the exotic autos seen at this fun-filled JCNA event.

Ooops! We would be remiss to not applaud Bill Wheeler, the official Starter, and Cecelia Wheeler, the official Timekeeper, without whom this event would not have been soooooo verrrrry successful!

“Florida Cracker” Monte Carlo Rally DeLeon Springs to Micanopy, FL Saturday, Dec. 13th, 2015

Central Florida is known today for Theme Parks, Medical City, High-Tech Training and Simulation industries and space exploration. Life moves fast and, when we travel, we often use the interstate system and major highways. Many of our children attend state universities that are huge --the University of Central Florida is the second largest in the country. But there was a time in old Florida when things were more simple. Life moved slower and people had time to see the real Florida of forests, back roads, family farms and small towns.



JCOF has participated in the Jaguar Clubs of North America (JCNA) North American Rally competition for years and we were due for a competitive event in 2015. Jay Hixson, our JCOF Rally Master decided to combine a competitive Monte Carlo Rally with the theme of old Florida – and named it the “Florida Cracker” Monte Carlo Rally.



A Monte Carlo Rally is organized as a timed event, centered around a sequenced start for each entrant, followed by check points at which each car is timed against a standard target. The goal is to arrive at every check point at exactly the target time given to the driver and navigator at the start of the rally. Routing and mileage is not tracked or graded, the only criteria is to arrive at each check point at the target time. A perfect leg would have the car cross the timing gate at exactly the target time, points are deducted for each second the car arrives before or after the target time.



A Monte Carlo Rally has two competitive classes: M2 is the primary class and is for drivers and navigators who have participated in at least 2 previous rallies. M2N is called the Novice Class and is for those who have participated in less than 2 previous rallies. To qualify for official recognition as a finisher, the car must be a Jaguar and the driver and navigator must be members of JCNA. For the Florida Cracker Rally, we had 3 official entrants in each class, plus 4 other cars that were not officially competing.

The weather was perfect and warm. We started at one of our favorite breakfast restaurants, the Old Spanish Sugar Mill in De Leon Springs State Park, just north of Deland. All participants enjoyed a great “cook ‘em yourself” pancake feast and plenty of good conversation in anticipation of the keen competition to follow.



After breakfast, we met in the parking lot where the Rally Master explained the rules of competition. Maps with checkpoints and target timing were distributed and questions answered. John Falco --with assistance from grandchild Kingston-- was the official starter as the cars lined up for the sequenced departure. And away they went!

Our first checkpoint was at the Astor Family Market in Astor, a small town on Highway 40. This first leg was not difficult but the time allowed

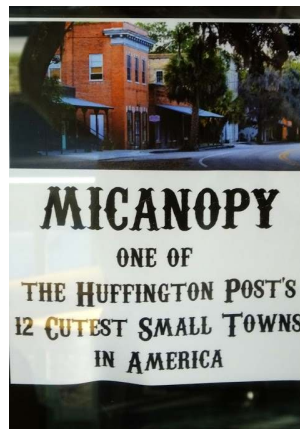
was very tight. After a 20 minute break, cars were again on the road en-route to the second checkpoint at the Salt Springs Square Shopping Center. Salt Springs is a beautiful little wayside in the heart of Ocala National Forest with access to Little Lake Kerr. This leg took us through beautiful and calm forests with views of Lake George. The leg was much longer and, with little timing flexibility, it was somewhat more difficult than the first. Again, 20 minutes were allowed for rest and then the cars departed on the third and final leg of the rally, ending at the checkpoint in Marjorie



K. Rawlings Historic State Park in Cross Creek. This leg was by far the most difficult with the longest distance and many confusing routing options. It was on this leg that separation occurred among the competitors. Marjorie Rawlings was a famous author who wrote during the 1930s, 40s and 50s and used rural old Florida as a setting for many of her works. Her most famous book was *The Yearling* which was made into a movie starring Gregory Peck and Jane Wyman. Drivers and navigators were given time to explore the Rawlings farm where she did most of her writing over the years.



To finish the day, we drove in conga-line style to the beautiful little town of Micanopy, with many shops, antique stores and restaurants. We gathered at the Old Florida Café for lunch as Jay and Karen Hixson reviewed the points and scores – arriving at the final standings shown below.

- and 3rd place Bill Robertson (driver) and Carol Robertson (navigator) driving a 2012 XKR convertible.

M2N Class (Novice):

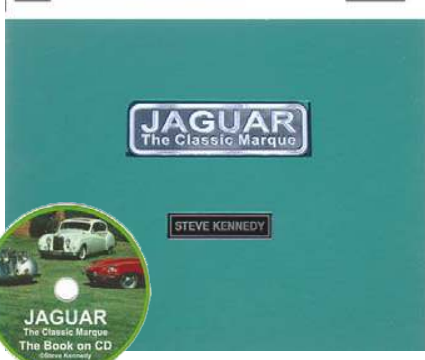
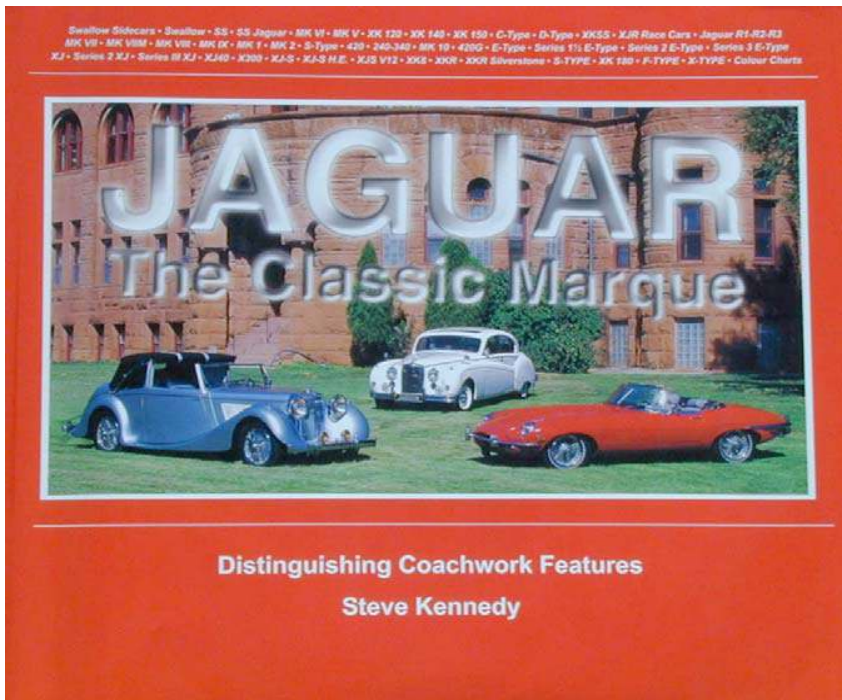
