

Lake Mirror Classic Auto Festival

This was the 16th Annual Lake Mirror Classic, staged by JCOF member, Ford Heacock and Heacock Classic Car Insurance. The Lake Mirror has grown to be counted among the finest classic and collector car festivals in America – often included in conversations including Amelia Island and Pebble Beach. Automotive luminaries such as Tom DuPont, publisher of the DuPont REGISTRY, and Bill Warner, founder of the Amelia Island Concours d'Elegance, again hosted Lake Mirror's awards program this year.



Before sunrise on Saturday morning, I drove the two hour trip from Ponte Vedra Beach to Longwood where I joined Juan and Genie Sierra and Juan's brother, Frank. The four of us wouldn't quite fit in Juan's recently restored 1960 XK 150 S, so we climbed into his comfortable minivan for the drive to Lakeland.

Genie agreed with me that Juan's not very good at taking directions. Somehow, though, we wound up finding a great parking spot, the very closest to Gate #1. Never mind that the only other vehicles parked there were motorcycles. We were delighted it was still there when we were ready to leave.

After a short walk to the lake, the first exotic car we saw was being shown by one of JCOF's newest members, John Sutton and his wife proudly displayed their absolutely gorgeous Suffolk replica of a 1936 SS 100. 'SS' cars were later named S.S. JAGUARS in 1936! Look forward to a feature article





about John's auto collection and racing successes in a future edition of JAGWire.

Soon after visiting with the Suttons, we were officially welcomed to the festival by JCOF's own Ginger Corda. Ginger might not have been the 'official' hostess for the event but she certainly had to have been one of the most flamboyant, gregarious, gracious and colorful. Later, we were delighted to find Ginger's original 1935 SSII (Jaguar) Tourer prominently displayed. Didn't the photo of Ginger's 'Jag' make a wonderful cover photo for this edition of JAGWire?

I once knew a girl who weighed 278 pounds but she said her friends told her, "I'm not fat!" Well, with 671 cars registered to display and over 40,000 attendees, I can honestly say that the "Lake Mirror Festival was not crowded!" Seperate collections of Mustangs, Corvettes, Hot Rods, Paninis, etc., etc., etc., were displayed on several streets around downtown Lakeland, close to Lake Mirror. This was the 16th year for his event and it was amazingly well organized. True classics, exotics and multi-million dollar collectibles are always found on the east side of the lake, together with classic boats, motorcycles and antique bicycles. We didn't see any Whizzers but were delighted to spot several WOODYS!



What would any classic or collector car show be without Jaguars? No one knows 'cause that doesn't happen. The Lake Mirror was certainly no exception with JCOF members' SSs and a number of XKEs. Surprisingly, we saw no original '50s "slab-siders." However, James Lloyd from Howey-in-the-Hills proudly showed his hand-crafted, one-of-a kind, 1953 XK Special which he had personally



designed. He combined mechanical and body parts from XK 120s, XK 140s, XK 150s and XKEs to create one of the most beautiful and exciting racing Jaguars ever. At just 2,200 pounds, this 'lightweight' earned five 'Best Jaguar In Class' and numerous 'First Place' Concours d'Elegance awards; including Lake Mirror and

An impeccably maintained Jaguar XKE with an unusual lift off hard top took First Place in the 1961 - 1965 European Sports Car class, right in line with other classics and exotics - all among the finest and most beautiful cars in the world!









This was the first year in which bicycles were exhibited, though none were newer than 1907. Several antique motorcycles were also crowd pleasers.



It wouldn't be a festival without food and one of the highlights of the Lake Mirror Classic is the parade of waiters, led by a bagpiper, bringing gourmet lunches to the judges and dignitaries. For those who could tear themselves away from all of the wonderful cars, Lakeland's beautiful Hollis gardens provided a quiet resting place.

It goes without saying that a good time was had by all, including Pete Betterman who was spotted in the crowd. As usual, JAGWire's photographer took lots and lots of pictures. 

There was a special place for one-of-a-kind type cars, such as a really beautifully restored 1976 XJ 2 door coupe. There was also a very pretty Mark I. Altogether there were around 47 cars entered in the Concours d' Elegance. Delmar should have been there with his fine camera.

There were quite a number of prizes awarded for the different categories. Our car is an XK 150S OTS and was placed in category C4/150. It received top honors in its class and was awarded Best in Class. But that's not all. Our XK 150 was further honored with the Peoples Choice Award! This is a very interesting award. Everyone with a car entered was given a small blue card which you signed and wrote the NUMBER of your choice for People's Choice Award car (obviously you cannot vote for your own car). This caused all participants to walk around and view all of the competing vehicles, then decide which entrant they liked most. Our car received the highest number of votes and I am pleased to say that quite a number of people stopped, took pictures and expressed favorable opinion.
