Jaguar Club of Florida Minutes and Understandings of the Membership Meeting April 21st, 2016 Alaqua Country Club • Longwood FL



The JCOF meeting was opened by club President Juan Sierra at 8:00 PM.

Members in attendance were: Juan and Genie Sierra, Tom and Liza Wright, Joseph and Marina Tarnowski, Bob and Sandy Lewis (new members), John Falco, Will Hoehndorf, Jay Hixson, Steve Handler.

President Sierra introduced and welcomed new members Bob and Sandy Lewis and encouraged them to participate in the club's activities.

Treasurer John Falco gave the financial report of the discussed expenses and income from the Concours d' Elegance. As of April 21, 2016 the club has a total of \$12,301.91 in equity.

John Falco suggested that the club donate \$1300.00 to the Michael J. Fox Foundation since the silent auction at the Concours raised that amount. Following a short discussion, a motion was made and seconded and approved by the members to send a check for \$1300.00 to the MJF Foundation.

President Sierra then discussed the silent auction at the Concours d' Elegance. He paid a special tribute to Delilah Davis, Marina Tarnowski and Cecelia Wheeler for their hard work in putting together the auction. Without their effort as well as the generosity of members and sponsors who contributed most of the gifts, the auction would not have been possible.

Jay Hixson, Concours Committee Chairman, gave a brief summary of the March 19th Concours at Celebration. A total of 37 cars were registered: 17 in Championship Division; 7 in Driven Division: 10 in Display Only; and 3 in Special. Jay was especially thankful for the committees teamwork and members who helped wherever they were needed. Jay gave special kudos to Genie Sierra, Norma Hoehndorf and Marina Tarnowski and the banquet committee people who put together the beautiful table decorations.

Tom Wright, Chief Judge, briefly discussed the judges training prior to the Concours and expressed his thanks to all the members who attended the full day session. We watched the weather forecast with trepidation during the week leading to the annual C&C at Amelia. The forecast was for thunderstorms up until the Friday when the forecast suddenly changed to 'sunny'. Sunrise on Saturday was hardly sunny, a heavy mist shrouded everything in a dull gray surreal light. At the show field, a light mist endured through midmorning as shown by the arrival of David Gillespie's 1973 E-Type.

year's Amelia C&C: the Jaguars were mixed in with other cars and parked on a first come basis rather than being lined up together. We were parked in the general area of the Jaguar Cars displays. We also lost a number of Jaguars as a number of JCNA members elected to take their non-Jaguar classics, including a 1948 Riley Roadster, a 1955 MGTF and a 1958 Healey. We also lost JCNA members Danny and Dianna Bogdany and Jill Casiple whose cars were relegated to a separate fairway due to late registration. With the added display area, however, over 400 exciting autos were on display for the enjoyment of over 6,000 Saturday spectators.



Among several interesting Jaguars on display were the 1952 XK120 Roadster owned by Jim Parker and the lovely E-Type Fixed Head Coupe displayed by Jerry Wise. From the last edition of JAGWire, you might recall that Jerry's former E-Type was purchased by the Museum of Modern Art (MoMA) and is currently a featured display.

JCOF president Juan Sierra and wife Genie proudly displayed their 1960 XK 150 S OTS which had recently gone through a complete restoration taking over three years. Unfortunately, JCCNF president Dyaarl Anderson and wife

But for those attending the Amelia Island Concours d'Elegance, this meant one less hour you had to wait to get onto the field and discover what Bill Warner and his team put together for fans of all things automotive.




There was an assortment of special judged classes including the cars of Honoree: Hans Joachim Stuck and Greenwood Corvettes. Also of interest was Janis Joplin's psychedelically painted Porsche 356 Cabriolet.





The weather forecast for the day was rain starting at about 2:00. Last minute adjustments were made and both the judging and the award ceremony were started early this year. Everything appeared to go well and all was complete before any hint of rain. Thankfully, the rain did not actually dampen the magnificent greens of Amelia or the spirits of spectators until after 4:00. Meanwhile, Wayne Carini, proudly showed the '49 Buick Roadmaster from the movie Rain Man which his company had restored. Wayne also






posed for photos with fans, including Delmars' grandson, Alex Casiple. Research by this writer revealed that the Buick had been leased by its owner to United Studios for 5 months for \$357.20/week back in 1988.

Of undeniable interest to Jaguar fans was the 1934 SS1 Walmsley Roadster





Chairman, managing director and co-founder of Swallow Side Car Company (which became Jaguar Cars in 1945), William Walmsley designed and built this for himself in 1934. This was the same year Walmsley sold his interest in the company to Sir William Lyons. The Roadster is now owned by Jaguar collector, Brian Beni who restored it back to its' original specification. This was the car's first and, to date, only public showing since restoration. Jaguar of North America graced it with the Amelia award:



"The Most Historically Significant Jaguar"



Jaguar Cars corporate display featured the entire 2016 model line-up, including the new XE and F-PACE which will both be on sale in North America in May. Also available for visitors to Amelia was a Jaguar Ride and Drive program which was every bit as popular as one would expect.

Amelia Island Auctions, 2016

Among the more exciting events at Amelia Island Florida's Concours weekend –always the 2nd weekend in March – are the Classic and Collectible Car Auctions. Previewing and sales are held from Thursday through Saturday at numerous locations around the island. This year's auctions of note included: RM Sothebys; Bonham; Gooding & Co; and Hollywood Wheels.

Because JCOF members, Tom & Liza Wright, were offering their JCNA award winning 1958 Jaguar XK150 S Roadster at Gooding & Co., that's where I spent most of Friday afternoon. As Tom wrote in an article for the UK Club's XK Gazette:

It was not a good day for Jaguars at the Amelia Island Gooding Auction. An XK 120 OTS and a Series I E-type OTS were sold with no reserve at prices well below their estimates. Our XK 150S OTS did not meet the reserve we had set and was not sold. As a result, Gooding has a 30 day exclusive right to sell the car at or above its reserve. Our OTS came up on stage shortly after the sale of a Ferrari for over \$15 million. That auction took a long time to reach the final bid, moving up slowly in \$25,000 increments.

When the bidding was completed, much of the audience dispersed. One observer said, "The oxygen went out











of the room." In contrast, the bidding on our car went up very quickly, although in smaller \$10,000 increments. But the bidding stalled short of the reserve we had placed: we had no intention of dropping or lowering our reserve, so we will accept this result for now and move on until we find the right buyer for our car.

Juan and Genie Sierra and JAGWire Editor, Robert Delmar, shared the excitement at Gooding.




I didn't have time to take in all four auctions on the island but happened to stumble on Hollywood Wheels, a surprisingly delightful event at Amelia's Omni Hotel. Inside and in the gardens of the Omni, many classics were beautifully displayed. My favorites were Chrysler Corporation's 'Fantastic Fins' from the days of my misspent youth in the fabulous fifties.

Though not abundant, Jaguars were also offered at the Hollywood Wheels auction. In fact, two incredible XK E-Types – one with just 1,600 miles (red) and one with just 6,000 (black)—were offered and expected to sell for up to \$5,000,000. Unfortunately, neither met reserve. It was just not a good day for Jaguars.







I was fortunate to meet the owner of the red 1973 E-Type, Walt Gilmore from Winter Park. He and two business partners purchased three '73 Jaguars: Dr. Honey's XKE 2+2; Dr. Buzlea's XJ6 sedan; and Mr. Gilmore's E-Type DHC. Rather than driving his Jaguar, Mr. Gilmore decided to compete in the fledgling International Show Car Association. ISCA took issue with Jaguar's quality of paint jobs before the "Robot" era and, after receiving low marks for paint quality, Mr. Gilmore had a meeting with three head people from Coventry, England. One expert ICSA judge said it looked like

they [Jaguar] "...had used a 4" brush." That did not go over well with Jaguar. They did, however, agree that the XKE ought to be repainted so long as they did not have to pay for it or admit the quality was poor, maintaining that their cars were intended for racing and driving, not 'show car' competition. After having David Ross Automotive repaint the XKE, Mr. Gilmore went on to win the championship 1979-1980 ISCA Grand Finals with 100 points.



Mr. Gilmore also commissioned Mr. Charles Townsend to produce a one of a kind wood sculpture of a "Leaper" at 8' 6" long. This beautifully hand carved masterpiece was delivered in just under a year. After being introduced to Walt Disney by Mr. Gilmore, Townsend went on to create many more pieces of art for Disney before he passed.

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
