


























About The Club

Jaguar Club of Florida Minutes and Understandings of the Membership Meeting May 2016 • La Madeleine Country French Café



The JCOF meeting was opened by club President Juan Sierra at 7:55 PM.

Members in attendance: Juan and Genie Sierra; Danny and Dianna Bogdany; Bob and Sandy Lewis; Will and Norma Hoehndorf; Joseph and Marina Tarnowski; Steve and Iris Handler; Asa Fulton; Ian Crawford; Bruce Barnwell; John Falco; Jay Hixson.

Old Business:

Members discussed pros and cons of a new meeting venue. President asked for a motion which was seconded and approved to continue to meet at the La Madeleine Country French Café. Juan Sierra encouraged members to keep an eye out for other possible venues in case the new venue is no longer practical.

President Juan initiated a discussion about publishing a special edition of JAGWire which would be dedicated to the last Concours d'Elegance in Celebration. Members agreed that Robert Delmar should feature the Concours in the next edition. Note: Editor's Corner—an often informative and amusing column in JAGWire—in the March-April edition of JAGWire [page 5] announced that the May-June edition would feature activities of the Concours weekend. In a separate discussion, members were interested when the first JAGWire newsletter was published in its current format. Juan Sierra showed some hand-outs and calling cards which advertised the Jaguar Club of Southwest Florida and suggested that JCOF should consider doing something similar. John Falco mentioned that the flyer and calling cards were available for purchase from JCNA and could be personalized. Danny Bogdany volunteered to check with JCNA on how to get these materials and at what cost. A motion was made by Danny Bogdany, seconded by Steve Handler and passed by the members that Danny work with JCNA to get similar materials for JCOF.

Juan Sierra suggested that the club re-start the small fundraiser at every meeting as was done in the past. A motion was made, seconded and passed by the members to restart the fund raiser. Iris Handler volunteered to get new tickets from Staples. Marina Tarnowski volunteered to help sell the tickets at future club meetings.

Juan encouraged all members to participate in the June 25, 2016 Summer Slalom at Tavares. Tom Wright will be in charge of the event. Helmets are required and will be provided by JCOF. Used helmets are often for sale on eBay.

Juan announced that the next meeting will be on June 16th and the July meeting on the 21st.

New Business:

Jay Hixson discussed the Fun Drive scheduled for Saturday, June 18, 2016. This will be an 80 mile drive, including the Ormond Scenic Loop and Trail. The drive will start at 8:15 AM at De Leon Springs and will end at the Winter Home of John D. Rockefeller in Ormond Beach. Lunch will be at 12:30 at Alfie's Restaurant, Ormond Beach.

Juan Sierra initiated a discussion whether the club should waive the participation fee for first-time participants to increase new member participation. Motion was made, seconded and passed by the members not to charge new members the registration fee for their first-event participation. Norma Hoehndorf, Iris Handler and Sandy Lewis volunteered to contact new members and invite them to come out for the club's events scheduled for June 18 (Fun Drive) and June 25 (Slalom).

President Juan Sierra welcomed new member Marc and Cindy Hall. Juan also explained that new members would not be charged for entering their first club event.

Minutes of the last meeting were discussed and Tom Wright requested that the reference to the helmet requirement be changed to state that the club would have enough helmets available at the Slalom so that individuals would not have to bring their own helmets. Also, a typo about the June 18th date of the Fun Drive needed to be corrected. Minutes will be corrected before they appear in JAGWire.

If payment for a renewal of their advertisement is not received by the end of the first quarter the account is closed and no further ads are run in JAGWire

Jay Hixson gave a brief report of the upcoming Fun Rally to Ormond Beach and the tour of the John D. Rockefeller winter home. Twenty-two cars and 43 people are registered. Start time will be 9:00 AM from Ponce De Leon.


After Friday night's get together for cocktails & dinner, and after Saturday's outstanding Concours d'Elegance which was not spoiled by drizzling rain, and after Saturday evening's gala awards banquet

and silent auction, who woulda 'thunk' that Sunday's Road Trip would highlight the weekend?

Interim Rally Master "Mac" Ballard did his planning, and did it well when he chose the recently opened Whispering Oaks Winery near Ocala as our destination. More important, the wayward



routes he chose made getting there an experience in itself. One couple who lived in Florida all their lives said they never dreamed there was so much different terrain and interesting scenery in their native state. Nope, you won't see such on the main highways and interstates, so Mac steered us down some narrow backwoods roads.





two-lanes after that. Did you know that Florida's 870 square mile Green Swamp, northwest of I-4 and Hwy 27, is the Floridian Aquifer and supplies fresh water to the majority of Florida's population? It's in stark contrast to the steep hills, orange groves and horse farms atop the Lake Wales Ridge – believed to be the first land on the peninsular to have come from the ocean and running from the north in Leesburg to the south in Lake Placid. No telling what the birds and animals thought as our Jaguars went roaring by – well within the speed limits of course. OF COURSE!









Some of our people had not really looked forward to sampling wine made from Florida grapes but none was to be had at this new winery. Instead, over 48,000 blueberry plants are cultivated to make wines for several different tastes. Our gracious hostesses 'insisted' that we sample several types – an invitation which was enthusiastically accepted by most.

Mac discovered that our favorite Jewish Deli had a catering branch just 15 minutes away. WOW! Let's do lunch from TooJays like this again!

But that's not all! A jug of wine, a loaf of bread, and music! On Saturdays and Sundays Whispering Oaks has music in the beautiful courtyard. This made our respite even better.

After wine and lunch, some of us wanted to take a nap but our special tour of the winery was in store.

Like everything else at Whispering Oaks, the winery was spotless – absolutely spotless.

It may go without saying that many of us wanted to take home several bottles of that fascinating blueberry wine. Whispering Oaks was most obliging. Their wares are sold in several retail outlets,

including Trader Joes and online at http://WinesOfFlorida.com.
