

The Concours also successfully achieved our other goal of community service.



Amelia Island Concours d'Elegance 2017

My unshakable XJ delivered me to Amelia Island on Thursday to get a head start on the 2017 Amelia Island Concours. I was rewarded with photos of an early E-Type with external bonnet locks for sale at the Bonhams auction and a test drive in Jaguar's performance oriented "F Pace S" model. (How fast will an F-Pace S go in a 25 mph zone? Only Ginger Corda and the "very nice officer" know for real).





Friday included a dash to Center Street in Fernandina Beach to see the public viewing of fine automotive machinery on display as part of the Reliable Carriers Eight Flags Road Tour. Nobody has more fun at an event than JCOF members and the Amelia Island Concours d'Elegance was no exception. To close out Friday, Ginger Corda reserved space at the Millhouse Steakhouse and what started as a small gathering grew to a group of 17. Some of the group elected to continue the

fun after dinner by roaring off to a dive bar that held the interest of some of our gallant group until 1:00 in the morning.



Because Sunday's forecast was for buckets of rain, the Concours was moved to Saturday. That made the 22nd running of the Amelia Island Concours a condensed affair, running concurrently with the Saturday Cars and Coffee event. On the Concours field one could find three XKSS including the famous Steve McQueen car now owned by the Petersen museum.

Perhaps more spectacular was a generous collection of 11 D-Types, including the 1956 Le Mans race winning number 4 car and Le Mans 1957 winning number 3 car. Filling the field between the two was the trophy from the 1957 Le Mans race.



On the Cars and Coffee field one could find a few more

Jaguars including an XJ220 owned by JCOF member Ian Crawford.







On Sunday several JCNA members attended the "Legends of the Leaping Cat - Jaguar Racing Drivers Seminar." Guest speaker and Sebring resident Bob Tullius said that his time in the Air Force inspired the professionalism that became a hallmark of Group 44. The meticulously prepared and visually appealing Jaguars, along with the spotless white uniforms, created team pride which in turn attracted some of the best mechanics and drivers.

Michael Quinn (grandson of Jaguar founder Sir William Lyons) said that it was the sedans and the US market that carried the brand. Quinn also noted that getting into a Jaguar always brings about a sense of occasion.

Jaguar's legendary test driver and development engineer, Norman Dewis, (pictured with Ginger Corda) spoke of his work with Dunlap and Jaguar to develop disc brakes for automotive use as well as his dash to Geneva to deliver a second E-Type to the famous Motor Show following a last minute



decision by William Lyons to have a coupe present. Lyon's decision surprised Norman at the end of his work day and put him in an E Type with a suit case and lunch packed by his wife along with a mission to drive through the night. Norman was also instrumental in developing the XJ13 and just about everything else at Jaguar from 1952 to 1985. At 96 years of age, Norman is still going strong and a pleasure to talk to. Perhaps the secret to a long and joyous life is to spend time driving a variety of magnificent Jaguars, or possibly, the 1953 Fiat 8V Supersonic by Ghia that sold for \$1,375,000 at the RM/Sotheby Amelia Auction.

The 30th Annual JCOF Concours d'Elegance was held on April 8, 2017 at the Route 46 Entertainment District in Sanford and, once again, was a great success! Each year this event has a



silent auction to raise money for the Michael J. Fox Foundation for Parkinson's Disease Research. Parkinson's disease is a disorder of the brain that leads to shaking (tremors) and difficulty with walking, movement, eating, coordination and more. As many as

one million Americans live with Parkinson's disease every day, which is more than the combined number of people diagnosed with multiple sclerosis, muscular dystrophy and Lou Gehrig's disease.



JCOF dedicates the silent auction each year in honor of my mother, Velma Jo Cavallero, past longtime loyal JCOF member, who had Parkinson's for over 28 years. Before Jo showed signs of Parkinson's she loved to dance, cook, talk, paint, attend our Concours, Road Rallies and more. After living with Parkinson's for over 28 years, she struggled to be able to talk and do for herself. She was wheelchair bound and struggled to have a simple



conversation. This devastating disease turned a lively energetic person into a person who needed help every second of every day.

This year's silent auction had many donations from businesses and club members. Attendees had the opportunity to bid on 170 items which included everything from car detailing products to custom jewelry to one-of-a-kind items. We made over \$1,700 dollars that will go directly to the Michael J. Fox Foundation in hopes of finding a cure for this disabling disease.

We could not have had such success without such generous donors and enthusiastic bidders. I want to thank Delilah Davis for accepting and storing the donations and delivering them to the

banquet for set up. I also want to thank those who helped with set up: Iris Handler, Janice and Jerry Wise and especially Mike Bass with the Route 46 Entertainment District for pitching in and being a tremendous help! Thanks also to Bob Lewis for heading up the sponsorships and donations.


