For those who never knew John, as well as those who remember him well, I found the following photographs which are hoped to recall some fond memories:




Judy and I were in Washington, D.C. the week before Hilton Head Island's annual Concours d'Elegance. Judy attended genealogical seminars while I stayed in the hotel working on the September-October edition of JAGWire. On the way home, we had decided to stop at Hilton Head, SC and enjoy the Concours with which I had become an enthusiast last year. Like last year, the island had been ravaged by a severe hurricane just weeks before. Also like last year, the neighborhood "lowlanders" had rallied together to clean up, or sometimes hide, the debris so that the show could go on.

Unfortunately, we got a late start into the "parking lot" traffic around D.C. and arrived at the Concours in mid-afternoon. Judging and awards had already started and, apparently, many participants had already left the beautiful Port Royal Golf Club fairways display areas. I was disappointed to estimate what appeared to be fewer than half the exotic autos on display as in 2016. Fortunately, I quickly found an excellent spot to photograph award winners as they drove to the judges' stand to accept their awards.

If nothing else (and there was certainly a great deal more), everyone associated with this event -- including judges, participants, vendors and guests-- exemplified southern hospitality and graciousness at its finest!

JCOF members, Juan & Genie Sierra and Jerry & Janice Wise, who competed in the Hilton Head Concours last year were unable to compete this year. Both couples were recuperating (probably financially) from their trips to Monterey, CA where they attended the Pebble Beach Concours the previous August.

The top honor at Sunday's Concours d'Elegance, 'Best of Show,' was awarded to a 1934 Cadillac Victoria Convertible Coupe owned by Steven Plunkett of London, ON Canada.





Attendees at the event chose a 1953 Chevrolet 3100 Good Humor Ice Cream Truck as their 'People's Choice' winner. The car is owned by Barry and Deborah Fodor of Ashland City, TN.

Another top honor presented at the close of the annual event was the Paul Doerring Founders Award, established to honor Paul Doerring, one of the key contributing founders of the event. The award went to a 1967 Ferrari 275 GTS/4 NART Spyder from the Rare Wheels Collection in Windermere, FL.

This trio of winners exemplified the diversity and quality of vehicles shown at Hilton Head Island. I had to applaud the Peoples' Choice selection of the '53 Good Humor Ice Cream Truck. Unfortunately, it had no ice cream for sale on this rather warm lowcountry day.

Numerous automotive icons were in attendance including Ben Ebel (Chairman, Michelin's Global Challenge Design Program), Michael Furman (automotive photographer), Ralph Gilles (Head of Design, Fiat Chrysler Automobiles N.V.), racer Boris Said, Jay Ward (Creative Director of the "Cars" Franchise, Pixar Animation Studios) and Automotive Hallof-Famer Ed Welburn (GM's Former Global Design Chief). Renowned contributors to the automotive collector hobby Ken Gross and Robert S. Jepson, Jr. of Savannah, GA were recognized as the 2017 Pinnacle and Honored Collectors.

JCNA Sanctioned Monte Carlo Rally

JCOF CatDrivers started gathering at 8:00 AM at central Florida's "castle of culinary delights," the Yalaha Bakery in beautiful downtown Yalaha, FL. Where the H--- is Yalaha? WellIII, if you go northwest of Orlando, drive through Howie in the Hills and continue east on Hwy 48 for ten miles, you've gone too far. It's fairly easy to miss the unique German Bakery, but well worth turning around to indulge in some of the most delightful

Last year's winners, Robert and Judy Delmar, came within only one second of a perfect score and were later named JCNA North American Champions.



Lots of the laughs come from watching competitors driving in opposite, obviously wrong, directions from the route your navigator has chosen. OR, could your navigator be wrong? We're not sure, but it's possible that some of our people might still be hopelessly lost. After all, Rally Master Jay always chooses the hilliest, curviest, twistiest, and hiddenest routes to get from Point A to 'Where in the H--- are we?"


