It was early summer when I last wrote about the significant progress the Coventry Foundation made in the first half of the year; including, a steady increase in Patrons and Patron donations and the establishment of a Foundation home in the British Sports Car Hall of Fame in Petersburg, Virginia.

In addition to monetary donations we have received another automobile, a series 3 E-Type, and there continues to be an excellent flow of memorabilia and literature.



2017 LAKE MIRROR CLASSIC & LAKELAND AUTO SHOW


One of the advantages of living in the central Florida area is being able to attend a variety of automotive events and one of the bigger events is the Lake Mirror Classic (Recently renamed the Lakeland Auto Show and Lake Mirror Classic).

The Promenade surrounding Lake Mirror is where the Concours is held to display a variety of wonderful machines, including a


sampling of the kind of hardware one might find at Pebble Beach or Amelia Island. This is where I found a

couple of E-Types, a 1952 XK120, a 1964 Mark 2, and a 1950 Mark V. The Mark V is owned by JCOF member, Ford Heacock, who was also the founder of the Lake Mirror Classic.

One of the Non-Jaguar highlights of the show was a pair of second generation, Corvette Stingrays. One was custom ordered with extra gages including an altimeter for GM Styling boss and legend, Harley Earl, the other was custom ordered with two extra taillights for Harley Earl's successor and the father of the Stingray, Bill Mitchel.



If you have been to this show, you know that parking can be a challenge. There are a couple of free parking garages by Lake Mirror which normally have space if you arrive before 10:30 AM. Otherwise, you will have to hunt surrounding streets for a vacancy. Despite a forecast for clouds, the weather was sunny and warm, which is typical for this show.

Our August California Vacation Trip, a/k/a Pebble Beach Concours d'Elegance

As it is with most vacations, there were a number of reasons for wanting to visit our old California stomping grounds last August. First was my desire to revisit the Pebble Beach Concours d'Elegance. This is really the premier auto show in the country; probably in the world. The weather turned out to be truly magnificent and in true Montery, California style. This year's Concours displayed cars from 15 countries, 31 states, and was attended by celebrities like ex-governor Arnold Schwarzenegger and Jay Leno.



Among numerous activities scheduled, the auto auctions bring phenomenal cars and even more phenomenal price tags. Godding & Company, the official auction house at Pebble Beach, reported sales of \$91.5 million – *dollars* that is! The Pebble Beach Tour took place prior to the Concours and provided a beautiful parade.



You can take your car on the Tour without participating in the Concours competition.

As a Jaguar enthusiast, I naturally sought out whatever Jaguars were being displayed. There were four. Taking S econd in Class was a

1954 Open Two Seater (OTS). Another interesting 1952 OTS won no awards but had an interesting

custom-made top to cover an unusually tall owner. A 1957 XK 120 Zagato Coupe competed in the O-2 "Postwar Closed" class against a XK 140 Pinin Farina coupe which won that class.

The one that caught my eye was a 1954 XK 120 SE Pinin Farina Coupe that was shipped to Pebble Beach from the UK. Imagine a British car with an Italian flavor, a/k/a an *Italian Jaguar!* This car won second place in its class among nine competitors. *The Car Guide* provided this explanation:

"This unique coachbuilt Jaguar XK120 was shown at the
1955 Turin Motor Show before being sent to Max Hoffman
in New York. Hoffman was the importer of many luxury
European automobiles during the 1950s. He inspired the
production of two significant vehicles, namely the Mercedes-Benz
300 SL Roadster and the BMW 507. He also brought the first ever XK 120 into the United States and he



personally worked with Batista Farina on this unique design to reinterpret the ground-breaking Jaguar."

While walking up and down the 18th fairway, I ran into other JCOF friends and supporters, Jerry and Janice Wise. We chatted for a bit and parted to see the Concours winners. There were so many Ferraris that for a while I thought it was a Ferrari Concours. However, when you stand next to a huge pre -war 1920's – 1930's Delage, Delahaye, Bugatti, Bentley, Rolls Royce, Isotta Fraschini, Hispano Suiza, Mercedes, Voison, Dusenberg, Packard, Cord or other 8, 12 or 16-cylinder monster, it's easy to understand why they usually walk away with all the cookies. Cars like Jaguar and Ferrari seem small (physically). Regardless of how many auto races or Concours competitions they may have won, they seldom get Best in Show at Pebble Beach.





This year was no exception. Best in Show went to a 1929 Mercedes-Benz S Barker Tourer. This car shown in light blue was a true beauty and a stunning automobile. Two other cars contending for Best in show were a 1932 Packard and a 1957 racing Ferrari. It's likely they'll be back in future years, but I understand that once a car has won Best in Show it is not shown again at Pebble Beach.

Genie did not join me at the Concours but, instead, opted to tour the beautiful town of Monterey where we had honeymooned. Our August vacation continued down the Pacific Coast Highway and, once again, we met Jerry and Janice Wise while touring Hearst Castle. If you have never seen it, we heartily recommend a visit.

The 2017 Jaguar Clubs of North America International Jaguar Festival hosted by the North Georgia Jaguar Club at the Lake Lanier Islands Resort was a great success. After entering the gate and driving up to the Legacy Lodge, it was obvious that the Lanier Islands are exceptionally beautiful. Comments by attendees from throughout North America confirmed our initial impressions.



Jaguar Club of Florida had a large and enthusiastic contingent of members including Jerry Wise, Patti Fox, Bob and Sandi Lewis, Phil and Denise Mannino, Danny and Dianna Bogdany, Jay Hixson, Will Hoehndorf, and Tom and Liza Wright. The Slalom was held Thursday morning leaving time for car cleaning in the afternoon.





In the evening there was a Welcome

Reception at the Lanier Point Pavilion with views of the beautiful shoreline from almost every angle. The weather was perfect, and with two bars open, we were soon laughing with old friends and making new ones.

On Friday the Concours at Pine Island Point, one of the many recreation and pavilion areas within the resort, had a very large turnout of beautiful cats, resulting in a long day of judging. The breadth of cars was incredible and included entrants from Canada, Mexico and as far away as Oregon in the United States.



We were fortunate to see the number 6 and 9 production E Types from 1961 among too many astounding cars to mention. That evening there was a sunset cruise on Lake Lanier with an alternative screening of the movie Grand Prix back at the Legacy Lodge.



On Saturday we had a choice of participating in a competitive Monte Carlo Rally or taking a Scenic Tour (both over 200 miles portal to portal). The roads and scenery in Northern Georgia are beautiful with many turns and elevation changes, spiced up by a hint of fall as leaves were just beginning to change color.

Saturday evening was the Awards Banquet in the hotel's ballroom with featured speaker Brian Redman. He regaled us with tales of his racing history and his love of cars spanning almost 50 years. Liza Wright was seated next to Kim McCullough, Vice President of Marketing for Jaguar Land Rover North America and they had a good discussion with at least some mention of Jaguars.



Danny and Dianna Bogdany were called to the stage to receive their award for First Place in Concours Champion Division Class C7/E3.

Tom and Liza Wright were presented with four awards: First Place in Slalom Class B

with a time of 49.059 seconds; Second Place in Concours Special Division Class S2/MOD Modified; Second Place in Rally - VIP Class (with a far from perfect score); and the JCNA
