- Next JCOF Meetings: April 21, 2018 at 9:30AM at the Village Inn, Winter Garden.



# **Judges Training**

One of the most important aspects of running a Jaguar Clubs of North America (JCNA) sanctioned Concours **d'Elegance** event is having a sufficient number of judges. Having enough judges is also a rough measure of the health of any affiliate club such as the Jaguar Club of Florida (JCOF). Luckily, JCOF has been blessed with Chief Judge Tom Wright who understands the critical importance of this issue and has made every effort to ensure JCOF has plenty of certified and apprentice judges for our Concours to run smoothly.

Among his many initiatives is annual judges training for JCOF members, with an open invitation to other affiliate JCNA clubs to join, learn and qualify. This **year's** training took place on Saturday, 20 January at the Alaqua Country Club, as guests of Juan and Genie Sierra. We had a full room with 12 trainees plus Chief Judge Tom Wright leading. We initially had discussions on the importance of certification and consistency in judging, delving into protocol, and conduct during judging.

The group also went through specific items of interest that JCNA is emphasizing this year. Next, we spent over an hour on the mechanics of filling out the judging forms. Paperwork? Yes, but if not done correctly it can significantly slow down the judging process and negatively impact competitive scoring. Finally, we got to the bottom-line business of preparing for and taking the judges test. All judges must pass this test every three years in order to participate as a judge in concours events. The test is open book, but one must read the questions carefully. Many of the answer choices are quite tricky, with numerous options separated by details that might seem minor, but In fact, are very important.

Currently, JCOF has 17 certified judges which is a testament to both Tom Wright and the enthusiasm of our club members.

After the classroom and book training, the group broke for a nice lunch in the country club restaurant, followed by hands-on training to judge some select members' cars assembled outside the clubhouse. This was a great time to ask questions and to get **Tom's** opinion of how he would proceed with specific situations that might be encountered during actual judging.

The JCOF 2018 Judges Training was a great success. We had lively and intense discussions, many laughs and a feeling of accomplishment when successfully completed. If you really want to understand the details surrounding your car and increase your role as a member of JCOF, becoming a judge is a great way to go. If you have any questions, Tom Wright will be happy to talk to you (772-713-3996).

Jaguar has revealed its first all-electric production vehicle, and perhaps the first true rival to the Tesla Model X. The 2019 Jaguar I-Pace will make an appearance at the Geneva Motor Show before heading to customers in the U.S. in the second half of the year.

The I-Pace delivers a total system output of 394 hp and 512 lb-ft of torque with the help of two electric motors. One motor sits at the front axle while the other is at the rear. A 90-kilowatt-hour lithium-ion battery sits between the two axles and is mounted low, contributing to a 50:50 weight distribution and a lower center or gravity. We had the opportunity late last year to ride shotgun in an I-Pace prototype, and walked away impressed by its ride and handling. We also had the chance to experience the prototype's acceleration, which felt even quicker than the 4.5-second 0-60 mph time Jaguar is claiming (Jaguar originally estimated 4 seconds for the prototype). Although EPA estimates are not yet available, the automaker anticipates a range of 240 miles.



So how does the I-Pace compare to its key rival? In terms of range, the I-Pace is most comparable with the base trim level of the Model X, estimated by the EPA at 237 miles, although the 100D model tops the range at 295 miles. The Model X can hit 60 mph in just 2.9 seconds in the P100D trim, but the 100D is estimated at 4.7 seconds and the base model at 4.9 seconds.

The aluminum-intensive I-Pace slots above the compact E-Pace as a midsize SUV. Measuring 184.3 inches in length, the I-Pace is just 2 inches shorter than the F-Pace. It looks pretty much the same as the concept version from a few years ago, retaining a cab-forward driving position, sloping roofline, hood scoop, bold character lines, and slim headlights. It also has available 22-inch wheels, and door handles remain flush with the bodywork until you touch them or command them to rise with the key fob. Inside the cabin, you'll find the new dual touchscreen system that we've seen in the Range Rover lineup.

Charging the I-Pace to 80 percent takes around 40 minutes with a 100-kW DC fast charger. With a 230-volt wall box at home, it takes 10 hours to reach this level. To help improve battery energy control software as well as infotainment technologies, the automaker has enabled over-the-air software updates for the I-Pace, a first for Jaguar.

U.S. pricing for the 2019 Jaguar I-Pace will be revealed at the Geneva show next week.
