

President's Corner:

- The Concours up-date: Our JCOF Concours held at the Waterfront Inn at The Villages was a success. The club broke even on the costs and the feedback from the attendees and guests was very positive. As a result, eight new members joined the club.
- News Update Editor: Will Hoehndorf continues to send out club updates via email blasts, as needed. The Secretary's Meeting Minutes are included in email blasts too.
- Past President Badges were presented to Ian Crawford and Tom Wright.
- Volunteers are needed to start planning for next year's Concours.
- **Charity Donations:** Coffee mugs with the JCOF logo brought in donations of \$317.00. Danny and Dianna Bogdany will match that amount. The \$634.00 will be given to the Florida Hospital Adult Blood and Marrow Transplant Fund in honor of John Falco.

Committee Reports:

- Treasurer Danny Bogdany reports that the treasury has about \$9,500.00
- **Membership- Steve Handler** reports that JCOF has 95 annual renewal paid-up members.
- **Rally Master** Jay Hixson reports that a joint Tour with the Ferrari Club is planned for April 28, 2018. Jay requests that members register ASAP and drive their Jaguars, if possible, in this tour. The drive will start at the Yalaha Bakery in Eustis at 8:30 AM.
- **Chief Judge and Regional Director** -**Tom Wright** requested that the Club renew its annual \$250.00 corporate donation to the Coventry Foundation. Tom will match the amount.
- Ian Crawford reported on the Southeast Regional Concours d'Elegance held April 14th and 15th in Punta Gorda, FL. The SWJCOF did a great job of presenting their 2 day Concours. JCOF judges assisted in the judging. The event took place inside the Convention center which was fortunate as rain was predicted. It was noted that there are benefits to having a hotel adjacent to the event.
- **The JCOF Summer Slalom** is set for June 30 at the same venue as the previous Slalom. Check the website for registration forms and directions. Tom Wright III is in charge. Ian Crawford invited all participants to his home following the Slalom.
- Jay Stoltenberg has volunteered to update the JCOF webpage. Jay Hixson will coordinate development needs.
- Advertising and Sponsorship- Bob Lewis reported that he is looking into possible new sponsors for JCOF events and contacting advertisers interested in short presentations at our club events.


A motion was made and approved by acclamation to close the meeting at 11:15AM.



JCOF 2018 CONCOURS D'ELEGANCE IN THE VILLAGES, FL By Will Hoehndorf

Now that our Concours is over, I decided to go to Wikipedia and look up what I was supposed to do. According to the Wikipedia, I was to prepare a 'competition of elegance' where prestigious vehicles are displayed and judged. I believe that our JCOF Concours met this definition 100% because our Cats are the most beautiful cars ever designed and, without question, they belong in the most prestigious category. Here is my story of how we organized our 41st Concours d'Elegance....

Shortly after the 2017 Concours ended in Sanford, I thought that The Villages would be an exceptional venue to host the 2018 event. When I mentioned my idea to my good friend Steve Handler, he said that he did the 2013 Concours there and that he could give me all the ins-and-outs about doing another event in our hometown. Before I knew it, I had a detailed history from the previous event and all the names of the hotel staff with whom I would need to negotiate about rooms, the awards banquet, a 'meet-and-greet' venue and, of course, reserved parking. In early May 2017, I met with the Hotel and Event Managers to reserve the needed rooms and outdoor spaces for March 17^{th.} ... St. Patrick's Day. We were really lucky to get some reserved rooms at a reduced rate as well as the Banquet Hall. March is high season in The Villages, so hotels and restaurants aree almost always booked.

Armed with a detailed proposal, I pitched the idea of holding the next Concours in The Villages to the members in attendance at our June Club meeting. To my surprise, I suddenly became Chair of the 2018 Concours d'Elegance.

My first act was to go back to the hotel and sign a formal contract for the Banquet Room, meal costs, discounted guest rooms, and the use of the hotel parking area.

Additionally, I had help from some friends with a new design for a flyer which I planned to send out by mid-August. Since you can't run one of these events by yourself,









I enlisted Joseph Tarnowski for registration; Jay Hixson for the Sunday Drive and parking on Saturday; Bob Lewis for several friends and searched for volunteers to take on some of the essential jobs. Tom Wright for judges; sponsors and the goody bags; Sandy Lewis to manage the registration desk; Jim McGrath for parking, and of course, my alter ego, Steve Handler, who kept me grounded.

I must not forget to mention the help of our ladies at the registration desk as well as at the banquet.

Between January and March 2018, I called the organizing committee together twice, once in Orlando and the second time at the Waterfront Inn in The Villages. The second meeting was of particular importance since it gave everyone a chance to see the venue and plan for the event accordingly. At that time, Steve and I finalized the menu selections, ordered trophies and finalized order for embroidered shirts which I had purchased two months earlier. In addition, I kept bothering Joseph Tarnowski to give me the latest count of participants. Our goal was to have 35 cars entered for judging, plus five or six display-only cars. As it turned out, we had 33 judged cars and 7 display-only cars.

We had told the hotel we needed 44 parking spots but the closer we got to March 17 the more I worried that we couldn't accommodate all cars in one area. As it turned out, we didn't have to.

All the planning you do never prepares you for the unexpected. I had negotiated with the hotel for a space to hold our 'meet-an- greet' get-together. We agreed that the hotel bar was big enough to take care of about 30 CatDrivers. What they forgot to tell me was that we had to share the bar with 50 or more horny singles who were holding a '50s dance. Eventually, we moved to the Veranda which had sufficient empty tables to take care of our group. It wasn't exactly what we had planned, but in the end, it turned out OK.

The parking lot in front of the hotel is a public lot over which the hotel has only limited control. I had worked with the hotel on the parking issue for weeks and was repeatedly told not to worry and that they would block 44 spaces for us starting on Friday afternoon. However, when I arrived at 7:00 AM on Saturday morning, the entire parking area which was supposedly reserved for us, was filled with cars that were not part of the Concours.

My stress level then reached 99% and did not recede until 'Rags Down'. Thanks to Steve Handler who hounded the Front Desk to make calls to guests to move their cars and to Jay Hixson who worked a miracle around the parking mess, the Concours was able to go on as scheduled. The sole spoiler was the owner of a van from New York who could not be located. And then there was the guv who drove up in a Jag and insisted that his car be judged. No matter what Jay told him, he simply wouldn't take NO for an answer. He eventually parked his car in an adjacent row where he could be seen by everyone.

I have a friend in The Villages Media Office whom I contacted to get some local publicity. He agreed to help and we had a nice article in *The Daily Sun*, The Villages newspaper, which has a daily circulation of over 100,000. He also arranged for the local TV station to run six spots on its *Schedule of Events* segment.

Our most significant publicity came from the local radio station which advertised the event on Friday and Saturday. A good guess is that we had between 4,000 – 5,000 spectators -- a pretty good number for any event. As I was walking around the parking lot during the Concours making small talk with the participants and spectators, I got the distinct impression that most everyone seemed to have enjoyed the day! That was really all I wanted to hear.

THE AWARDS BANQUET

To plan a banquet for a large group in a restaurant is inherently difficult. The first obstacle is to find an appropriate restaurant with a room that can seat 65 to 70 guests and is close to the Concours location.

You'll want to see a menu that offers dishes that appeal to most diners. Next, you have to consider total price per. I found that the Waterfront Inn meal prices varied more than \$10.00 depending on your selection. The Inn required a 30% down payment at the signing of a contract. The remainder was due two days before the event. They also required a firm number of quests 24 hours before the banquet. Our number of quests was 57. We could go 10% above that number but we were going to be charged for 57 diners minimum. It sounds easy enough to pick some dishes that appeal to everyone's palate but, in realty, it's not that simple. In the end, and Т went Steve with recommendations from the food manager who has done this for more than a dozen years

We selected round tables that seat only six people, which made for a more casual atmosphere and allowed guests to get to know their table mates. I made certain that only a minimal amount of chatter came from the podium.

While we were waiting for dinner to be served, we had a Fifty-Fifty Auction that raised \$200 -- half of which went to one guest.

Jim McGrath sold all of the special JCOf coffee mugs and raised a total of \$314.00. That amount was then matched by Diana and Danny Bogdany and sent to the hospital that took care of John Falco.

Finally, His Majesty, 'Dan the Great' appeared and awarded his coveted traveling trophy to Delilah Davis for her work on behalf of our club.

After all the preliminary levities were completed, we got around to the main purpose of the banquet: the awarding of trophies to the Concours winners. Our Chief Judge, Tom Wright, awarded 33 trophies – 18 First Places, 12 Second Places and 3 Third Places.


