

The Second Time Around JC07 Concours d'Elegance at The Villages

In the late 1950's, Frank Sinatra released a beautiful love ballad the first line of which started with "Love is Lovelier, the second time around, just as wonderful with both feet on the ground." The 2019 JCOF Concours d'Elegance at the Waterfront Inn in the Villages may not warrant a love ballad but I did enjoy being Chair of this wonderful and rewarding event a lot more 'the second time around.'

The idea of doing a second Concours came to me while walking through the streets of Jerusalem in late June 2018. That night I sent Steve Handler a text message asking him to check with the Waterfront Inn to see if March 15 -17 was still available and if so, to sign a preliminary contract with the hotel. After my return, I went to the Inn to sign a more inclusive contract which I hoped would be the same as the prior year, but ...surprise, surprise... the hotel presented me with a lengthy commercial contract which had all kinds of provisions that our Club could not live with.

The Club's legal advisor eventually told me not to worry too much about all the small print but to focus primarily on the costs. Even with that advice it still took us eight weeks to sign a contract. Although we now had a good contract with the hotel, we still had to negotiate with the restaurant for an affordable banquet menu.

The Chef's initial proposal exceeded our budget by nearly 45%. After four separate sessions we finally agreed on a menu which was well received by everyone. I found out later that the hotel got a new management company which saw 'Jaguar Club' and figured we would not notice the large price increase. The final hurdle we had to overcome was to secure 45 contiguous parking spaces in front of the hotel. The parking lot is owned by the The Villages and the hotel has little control over the spaces. It's always a problem to cordon 45 spaces on a busy weekend when parking spaces are at a premium. But thanks to the hotel event manager and her two-man crew, we were able to block 45 spaces beginning at noon on Friday. Luckily, by 7:30 the next morning we had managed to evict all but four cars from our reserved spaces. Kudos go to Angela Patterson, the event manager at the hotel and her crew for keeping our spaces clear.

Our traditional Meet-and-Greet on Friday evening had an auspicious beginning. When I made arrangements with the hotel for a reserved space, we expected about 30 people. However, by 6 o'clock on Friday evening, more than 45 CatDrivers had arrived. It was fantastic to see so many petrol heads get reacquainted with each other.

It was especially fun to meet 26 entrants from other Jaguar Clubs who were in attendance. We had one couple who drove 1301 miles from Appleton, Wisconsin to join us for our Concours. Willie and Jan Wittkopf received a special 'Long Distance Driving Award' for their enthusiasm and energy for their Herculean efforts.

The Concours on Saturday came off like a well-rehearsed play. Jay Hixson, Jim McGrath and four or five additional helpers parked 39 cars in the right order in the right spaces in minimum time. With the exception of the previously mentioned three cars on which we had to wait until their owners checked out of the hotel, everything went off without a hitch. Jay even managed to accommodate some late comers and same day registrants, while the Chief Judge was able to rework his judging teams to include the newcomers.

Tom Wight's Judges Training Seminars in January ensured that our Judges were well prepared. It was a pleasure watching the teams at work. They were thorough and professional in every respect, consistent in their evaluations and took their assignments seriously. A special note of thanks is due all of the Judges for their hard work and professionalism!

Our Awards Banquet is always a fitting end to the Concours, and this time was no exception. The Chef had prepared some exceptional dishes which ensured that everyone was in a great mood. It's always fun to watch the look of anticipation on all of the entrants faces when their Division is called and first, second and third place winners are announced. All in all, we awarded 30 trophies.

A word about the trophy selection.... I spent several hours looking through catalogs for appropriate trophies. I wanted something different from the usual awards but could not find anything I liked and so I finally opted to design my own trophies. I don't usually pat myself on the back, but I really believe this year's trophies were exceptional!



I would be seriously remiss if I did not mention Sandy Lewis, Norma Hoehndorf, Iris Handler and Anita McGrath for their hard work at the Registration desk. There is constant turmoil at the desk from 8 to 10 o'clock on Saturday morning. Everyone wants their registration package at the same time; late arrival and same-day entrants are looking for someone to approve their entry forms and get parked while others want individual questions answered.

At the same time our ladies signed up several new members while managing to keep their cool and getting everyone satisfactory answers. Without their help we wouldn't have a Concours and so thanks for your hard work!

Finally, I can't forget to give a special thanks to Karen Hixson, Iris Handler and Danny Bogdany who spent much of the day in our operation room adding numbers on the Judges scoring sheets and scrutinizing the scoring sheet for mistakes. You guys are the best!

So, what makes the second Concours that I chaired better than the previous one? For starters, I knew what I had to do to organize an exceptional event. All the negotiations with the hotel and restaurant were tedious but having experience from the previous year gave me a sense of how much both were willing to give.

I handled the pre-registration myself, so I always had current information of how many cars were coming, who was registered at the hotel, who was staying for the banquet, who was doing the Sunday drive and who wanted a Concours shirt. All this information made it easier to plan for the event.

As I mentioned earlier, I enjoyed designing our trophies for this year. The diamond shape was unique and represented, in a small way, the value we place on every winner. I was really happy when all the advance planning made this a great Concours and fun event. Sinatra was right, the second time around was indeed lovelier.

JCOF 32nd Concours d'Elegance Awards Recipients



Just one week after winning *Best in Class* at the Amelia Island Concours, this 1949 XK120 S Alloy (one of only 240 produced) earned Jaguar Club of Florida's *Best in Show*. This numbers matching car was purchased from two-time Argentine National Champion Bitito Mires' son-in-law and imported to the U.S. in 2007 after racing and spending 58 years in Argentina.




