

XF SPORT BRAKE

Smart alternative to a Crossover or SUV



Jaguar XF Sportbrake

The Sportbrake was formally revealed in March 2012 and went on sale in October of that year. It is now available with all of the saloon's engines and has a capacity of 19 cubic feet with the seats up and 59.2 cubic feet with them folded.

The maximum capacity surpasses rivals BMW 5 Series Touring, Cadillac CTS Sport Wagon and the Mercedes-Benz CLS Class (W218) Shooting Brake. The extended roofline increases headroom by 1.9 inches, and the rear bench includes a 60:40 split as well as a remote controlled 'one-touch' folding function.

The load area is fitted with multi-function rails and is 78 inches long and 41.9 inches wide.

What's New For 2020?

The 2020 Jaguar Sportbrake features several minor updates which include more standard features and two new paint colors: Eiger Grey and Portofino Blue hues.

Every 2020 Sportbrake now comes with Apple CarPlay and Android Auto capability right out of the box.

This Jaguar wagon does not offer the Checkered Flag Limited Edition which is otherwise available on the 2020 XF sedan.



Concours d'Elegance Preparedness Meeting Minutes Meeting Date: January 11, 2020, 5:00 PM Location: Marriott Hotel in Lake Mary in the Lounge Meeting Facilitator: Juan Sierra, Concours Chairman, JCOF



The meeting was called to order by Juan Sierra, Concours Chairman. Fourteen members of the Concours committee signed in.

Concours Chairman Juan Sierra reviewed the JCOF March 20-22, 2020 Concours d'Elegance planning and working status organizational chart that was handed to each member present. The following discussions took place on the work in progress:

Co-Chair Will Hoehndorf presented for approval a budget based on last year's. A discussion started about approving the budget. As there were a suggestion regarding a line item, it was decided to make the correction and send, via email, the completed document to members of the Committee for approval. Genie Sierra read Article V. Sect 1 of the JCOF By-Laws, which states that: "All normal club functions, i.e. Holiday Party and Concours must have specific budgets approved by the Board prior to any club funds being used for funding of such event(S)." Subsequent to the meeting, Will sent out the corrected Budget in an email and all members of the Board approved it. The email votes were filed with the Secretary. Advertisement Chairman Bob Lewis distributed the sign-up flyers to the members present and asked that they review the format. Members found minor errors that were noted by Bob for correction. He gave a presentation on how to present the flyer to potential Sponsors; both Jaguar-related businesses as well as other businesses that JCOF members might patronize.

Parking committee's Jay Hixson has the Master plan ready and completion can only be done at the Concours event.

Pavel Vacata (who was not able to attend) had previously requested a digital copy of the Hotel's map so that he could add labeling to the map's venues for the convenience of the car owners. Juan noted that the Marriott's contact person said that there was no digital copy of the hotel maps available.

Delilah mentioned that the theme for the Concours table decorations has been determined.

Chief Judge Tom Wright stated that late registration of cars can take place on the day of the Concours until 10:00 AM. After that time, cars can only be displayed, not judged. Tom mentioned that any late-registered cars, subject to space available, can be blended into the judge assignments.

61Years of the Mk 2


1959 was a pretty good year. Not a great year, but pretty good.

Nixon and Khrushchev did battle in the Kitchen. Harold Macmillan was the British PM. Alaska and Hawaii became the forty-ninth and fiftieth states. Bread was twenty cents a loaf and gas a quarter a gallon. On average, a new house cost \$12,400 and the typical wage earner grossed \$5,010 annually

The Austin Seven (Mini) went on sale for £500. Hudson and Nash merged to become AMC. Then things picked up when, in October, Jaguar introduced the Mk 1's successor, the significantly upgraded and enhanced Mk 2.

Under development since 1958 under the codename, *Utah*, the Mk 2's early demand required a 55% production increase by 1960. Over the course of the next eight years, Jaguar produced just shy of 84,000 Mk 2s with 2.4-, 3.4-, and 3.8-litre XK engine configurations. About 30% of the total production sported lefthand drive and was primarily destined for U.S. markets.

So, sixty years later, what do we have? Of the roughly 24,000 Mk 2s (LHD) shipped to the U.S., how many remain? 10%? Less?



Remember, back in the early '60s, they were just cars, not classic collectibles. Few were likely treated to the TLC they enjoy today. Certainly, natural attrition claimed many. And we cannot discount the factory standard feature of dreaded rust. We are left then, with the fortunate few. Many are meticulously restored to perfection. Some are one-owner, pristine, family heirlooms. Occasionally, multiple owners have diligently maintained their Mk 2s, preserving rare and desirable originality. Somewhere there must be a few still hidden away, untouched, unnoticed, and perhaps forgotten in an environmentally friendly garage.

And what is the tie that binds? The common bond? The unifying factor?

It is the Mk 2 Mystique.

The drama Mystique. On the British screen, fictional TV Detective Inspector Endeavour Morse insisted he drive a Mk 2 in every program — red with a black vinyl-covered roof. Drawing on reality, Inspector Morse realized that a spate of successful bank robberies could be traced to the felons' use of Mk 2s, faster and more powerful than standard issue police vehicles, to make their getaways. Soon, real police also demanded Mk 2s to equalize their speed with the bad guys.

The racing Mystique. In its day, the 3.8 Mk 2 was the world's fastest production saloon. World's fastest! It was developed for the track under the guidance of legendary Jaguar test driver. Norman Dewis. From 1960 through 1964, the Mk 2 dominated European racing in its class. It was, from time to time, driven by such racing luminaries as Sterling Moss, Mike Parkes, and Graham Hill. In 1963, a Mk 2 sponsored by Castrol Oil set new endurance records at Monza for 10,000 miles over three days and 15,000 kilometers over four.





The style Mystique. Once the bonnet is down, the Mk 2 is all about style. Jaguar debuted the Mk 2 with a look that clearly echoed the Mk 1, but lighter, more graceful and fashionable. The elegant, sweeping line of the Mk 2 derived in part from the narrower, chromed center post, larger rear screen, and re-designed front wings and sidelamp pods.

All are very much in keeping with Sir William Lyon's credo of *Grace - Pace -Space.* As a British wag (perhaps fictitious) once said, "One does not so much drive a Mk 2 as does one wears a Mk 2."

The classic/collectible Mystique. What can be said? After six decades, the Mk 2 still turns heads, gathers praise, stops traffic, attracts thumbs-up, and draws the occasional nostalgic sigh.

Following two years of ownership and shows, we are aware of three Mk 2s in the Chicago area and two more near St. Louis. Of course, there are more, if only a few more. Somewhere. But the message is clear. Mk 2s are in limited supply, and that supply will only decline. As caretakers of the marque, we have a responsibility to protect and preserve and when the time comes, find a good, new home for this rare and elegant Jag. After all, we do want a 71st anniversary, don't we?

THE FIRST MODEL TO BEAR THE JAGUAR NAME 1937 SS JAGUAR 2 ½ Litre Saloon CDU 70

This vehicle is on display in the Jaguar gallery at Coventry Transport Museum



This car was used by William Lyons' wife, Mrs. Greta Lyons (later Lady Lyons) for her own personal transport until 1946 and was then retained by Jaguar Cars. It is therefore known as the Lady Lyons Car. The knowledgeable enthusiast will spot that the radiator badge is a non-standard design, made especially on Mrs. Lyons' request.

Launched at the Mayfair Hotel, London in September 1935, this was the first model to carry the Jaguar name. When the car was revealed to the assembled journalists, William Lyons asked them to write down a price they expected the new car to sell for. The average guess was £632, [\$823] and there were gasps of surprise when Lyons announced that the car would cost £395 [\$514] for the $2\frac{1}{2}$ litre saloon model. This was the first four-door car offered by the SS Company. Together with the new body and the new name came a new overhead valve engine, developed with the help of consultant engineer Harry Weslake. This six-cylinder engine gave 102bhp, a great improvement on the 70bhp which had been available from the SS1 side-valve engine.

For the first two years, the Jaguars had coachbuilt bodies with wood frames, until the company adopted an all-steel body for the 1938 model year. Although the new manufacturing process caused many teething troubles, it eventually allowed a dramatic increase in production. Jaguar was the first of the small specialist car manufacturers in Britain to adopt all-steel bodywork.

The 2½ litre saloon was to remain in production up until 1949 by which time over 6,777 had been built, of which 3,444 were the original coachbuilt cars. There was also a four-cylinder 1½ litre model, and after 1937, the range was supplemented by the more powerful but otherwise identical 3½ litre model, while drophead coupé bodywork was introduced for all three models. The 2½ litre could reach a top speed of 86mph and return 21mpg.
