

JCOF July Meeting and Lunch with Spirits By new member Rhett Wilson

After recently saving a 1999 XK8 Cat convertible from the crusher, my wife and I decided to hang out with some Cat enthusiasts and learn about these fine automobiles.

On 30 July we attended our

first JCOF lunch meeting at Ashley's

Restaurant in Rockledge, FL with 21 other JCOF members. We made many new friends and everyone was inviting and welcoming. I particularly enjoyed my table companions' Jaguar excursion stories and advice.

The venue centered around Ashley's Restaurand being Florida's most haunted place. As a local Melbourne resident, I have frequently driven past, but was unaware of its stories. I should have been more curious and stopped, eaten, and learned the history. Ashley's was built in 1932 on the site of the former Flagler railroad Rockledge train station. It has been known as a tavern for much of its life. It was formerly Cooney's Tavern, The Madd Duchess, The Loose Caboose, Sparrow Hawk, and Gentleman Jim's. If some of the names sound like a gentlemen's' club, that's because it was for a few times over the years.

Guest speaker, Steve Kurtzke, is an enthusiast of the supernatural. Skeptics might easily try to discredit his findings at

Ashley's but there does seem to be recurring paranormal activity taking place there. Steve spoke not only of Ashley's history and stories, but also of his state-ofthe-art equipment used in manifestation detection.

Steve displayed very sensitive EMF readers which measure electromagnetic fields, temperature sensitive devices, night-vision cameras, motion detectors, voice recorders, and much more. He talked about the

equipment and demonstrated how each piece worked. He shared pictures, video and voice recording of Ashley's haunting personalities.



The main character in Ashley's haunting repertoire is Ethel Allen. She is believed to have been murdered there. Her spirit is apparently playful and shows up the most to be recorded. When entering the front door, go to

the right, and on the wall closest

to the rail road tracks are pictures taken of her ghostly appearances. She also likes to answer when asked, "Ethel are you here?"

She has been recorded responding, "Yes I am."



Steve has also recorded images of other spirits, including a small girl who was supposedly killed on the street in front of the tavern many, many years ago.






Judy and I might have won except for another couple blowing more bubbles at one stop, as required and part of the fun.

Sorting Miss Kitty part 2

This article is the second in a series of Sorting Miss Kitty. The first article can be found pages 12-13 in the May-June issue of JagWire.

Miss Kitty's entire exhaust system looked like Swiss cheese, and sounded like she was exhaling through open pipes... which for all intents and purposes, she was. The exhaust header pipe attached to the manifolds was split at the 'Y', and the pipes and muffler were riddled with rust holes. Adding insult to injury, on the trip from Los Angeles to Cocoa Beach, the rear exhaust hanger broke somewhere in New Mexico. At least 12-inches ground off the end of the tailpipe as it dragged on the pavement. I removed the entire system from the exhaust manifolds on back. No doubt Miss Kitty heaved a sigh of relief as she watched the remainder of her pipes and muffler go into the trash. Trying to keep with Miss Kitty's originality, rather than having a new exhaust pipe fabricated, the cracked one was repaired. No doubt she felt like she was sporting a new set

of clothes when dressed with I a shiny new set of 2 1/2-inch stainless-steel pipes and muffler. She now sounds like the distinguished British lady that she is, instead of a 75year-old farm tractor.



Ever since Miss Kitty came home with us, she had been running extremely rich, with black, sooty exhaust, stumbling and coughing, and backfiring from both carburetors and the exhaust at idle as well as at all engine speeds. New plugs, points, condenser, and rotor provided no relief or improvement. Plug wires and distributor cap all appeared to be okay. A compression test produced acceptable results in all cylinders. Adjustments to the twin SU carbs didn't help. It was obvious she was still suffering...sputtering, coughing, backfiring, and the same black sooty exhaust.

In addition to the pair of SUs, Miss Kitty has a third carb between the pair. Although Jaguar calls it a



starting carburetor, it's an electric fuel solenoid between the rear carb and the head, used for starting and warm-up. Close compari-Twin SU Carburetters son of it against several

different parts diagrams led to the discovery of a missing solenoid plunger spring. Burlen Fuel Systems sells the solenoid, plunger, and spring as a kit...but they were out of stock with no estimated delivery date.

Luck was once again shining on Miss Kitty, as someone

on eBay was advertising the kit for sale. Several days later Miss Kitty was fitted with the new spring. It was obvious she felt much, much better as her idle smoothed out, the engine properly accelerated, and the exhaust was much cleaner.



Now it was time for more test drives. She did okay at idle and at somewhat low speed operation, but after several seconds of increased speed and engine RPM under load, she again began stumbling and backfiring. Once again, it was time for some serious head scratching. Miss Kitty has 2 SU electric fuel pumps operating in parallel, which join outputs for a single feed to both carbs. Both fuel pumps felt like they were running to the touch...but operating them individually proved otherwise. One was functioning and one was not. The vibration felt when running them together was sympathetic from the 'good' one to the 'bad.' Still, one pump should supply ample fuel, so the next step was a flow test. The 'good' one was pumped into a metered container. Surprise. Surprise. It was only flowing 6 ounces per minute.

That's about 2.8-gal p/hr. Even running rich with the screwed-up carbs, Miss Kitty had been getting between 10-12 mpg. Traveling at highway speed with the engine turn-



ing approximately 2500 rpm, Miss Kitty needed 4-5-gallons p/hr. No wonder she was coughing, sputtering, and backfiring...she was starving. Fuel pump rebuild kits are available through Burlen... but you guessed it...they're

out of stock with no estimated delivery. However, back to eBay, where a brand-new pair of the exact same pumps were found. With them installed, she began purring contentedly.

Miss Kitty's fog lights had been missing for at least 37 years. A pair of on-hand Trippe safety-lites were installed. They looked good, but were obviously not what the 'Prince of Darkness' originally had in mind. A pair of Lucas SFT 576



were found and installed, which seemed more appropriate. However, per the advice of George Camp at The Coventry Foundation, these too were incorrect. He said Miss Kitty should be sporting a pair of Lucas SFT 700 'Flame-Throwers.' He had one and parts of another on the shelf, which Miss Kitty carried home. In search of missing parts for the second light, another pair of Flame-Throwers were found...not cheap, but nothing ever is. With those, Miss Kitty has her night vision correctly restored.



Now, if only a place could be found to put that pesky Florida license plate.

To be 'concours-ready' for judging, Miss Kitty still needs a bit more TLC. She is missing several parts made of that precious metal... *unobtanium*. These include an original air cleaner and plenum, heater control valve with switch, tool tray with lid, and more. Surprisingly, some of these and other needed parts have been located in Australia. Hopefully by the time you read this, they will have arrived in Cocoa Beach.

Another concern was potential sludge in the oil pan. The pan was removed, and over 3/8-inch of gunk was cleaned from it.



It seems everything with Miss Kitty has Incorrect Air Cleabeen a one-way street, as she keeps

begging for more and more attention. However that's not the case as she has entered several shows since the JCOF Lake Mary Concours in March.

Introducing 'Sir Charles' "Bad fuel plus being idle equals big problems!" Story 'Part 2 of 3' by Roger Crawford





To recap, we bought Sir Charles in February 2022 from an estate ...all his papers, history, etc. had been destroyed in a tragic California wildfire, right after he had

been moved to NC. The car had been partially restored and kept covered in a climate controlled garage for many years, both in California and NC. It had not been shown or even equipped with a California or NC license plate!

Unbeknownst to us, the car had been driven with very old/bad fuel...the fuel tank was full of rust and lots of bad stuff. Initially, the engine showed good compression. Then the first big clue of trouble became evident when the motor would not cool down properly ...it was not a pressure system!

We started our discovery by pulling the gas tank! Keep in mind, there are no easy to get parts for a 1948 Jaguar Mark IV!

This report is about fuel and then other repairs so please let me digress...

As you may recall, my wife Patty (aka 'Red Line' Patty) also has a 1974 E-Type Series 3, 'Audrey.' We quickly learned that proper fuel, driving a car every week, keeping a full fuel tank ...and learning to



syphon fuel in and out are necessary. Also, we now take our own fuel every where we show and keep a supply at home to top off after each ride. We have become very serious about the proper fuel. If you own an old car: read your owners manual, blend your own fuel if needed, *drive fast and drive often!*

Now, back to Sir Charles:

Taking the fuel tank out and thoroughly cleaning the inside, then coating the inside with epoxy paint was no easy task. All fuel lines, floats, joints and pump were thoroughly cleaned or replaced. We then took the head off of the engine ... What A MESS! The copper head gasket had folds in it that allowed leaks!

Next, we took out the pistons and crank shaft and almost cried looking at the scarring on the pistons! If we had continued running the engine, it would have meant a cracked block or worse! We had no history of what had been done (or not done) earlier to the car. We're guessing that it was partially restored, covered with only a little fuel in the tank, started only occasionally, then just sat there in a climate controlled garage as part of a classic car collection that burned up in the Ventura, CA fire right after Sir Charles was shipped to NC.

By the time you read this, the rebuilding of the engine in Sir Charles should be complete. Let's just say that the magic of buying a partially restored car fades quickly when faced with problems caused by bad fuel, etc. etc.!!!

At this age (I'm 77 and Patty is much, much younger),

time is often more important to us than money. We are drivers, not restorers ...we want to be at car shows and not in machine shops! Other problems resulting from the car just being stored where rusted speed and tach cables ...all fixed now.



3.5 Litre engine is *purrrring* nicely once again.

We had brake failure on one of our first test drives when the tab end of the brake cable broke off. The car has cable brakes and not hydraulic brakes. [This seems similar to brake problems George Cole experienced during his first drive in 'Miss Kitty,' a 1947 Mark IV sedan].

Finding proper white wall tires that were younger than 3 years old



was a nightmare ...older tires for 'show only' might be ok but not for driving! In addition to the challenge of finding 5 proper white wall tires, one of the wire wheels was missing one spoke and two others were damaged beyond repair. Try finding the proper spare spokes and better yet installing same!

The 'Finding and Care' of wire wheels and the correct tires for your driving and your wheels is a topic for another day.

Hopefully, we might now be at the end of what we're calling our *RE*=Restoration of Sir Charles. Our first show will be on Saturday, Sept 10 at Wakulla Springs (home of the Creature from the Black Lagoon). Then we're off to the International Jaguar festival (IJF) n Dallas, Tx the first week in October.

In November, Patty will be displaying Sir Charles on the main show field of the <u>Hilton Head Concours</u> d'Elegance with her chauffeur at the wheel. We are especially looking forward to the JCOF Concours d'Elegance in March, 2023. When will time and place be announced?

Our next report will be how Sir Charles likes car shows ...or rather how they like him. That third installment will be an account of how 'Charles' and 'Red Line' do at some shows! For openers, I know Patty will have me wearing a chauffeur outfit!
